This congregation worships on the ancestral and contemporary homeland of the Coast Salish peoples. We recognize the profoundly sacred relationship that our Native siblings have with the land and ask for forgiveness for the ways we have violated that which is revered by them and sustains us all.

Restrooms are located on the sanctuary level just past the library. In addition to men's and women's restrooms, there is an all-gender restroom that houses a changing table.

A staffed nursery is available for children. You'll find it on this same floor, through the library, down the long hallway on the left (just past the restrooms).

Children are always welcome in worship! In the narthex you will find build-your-own worship bags. Your children can spread out and play in the narthex (speakers in the narthex will allow you to worship from there) or bring the activities to your pew.

The Pray Ground is the space in the Narthex (lobby) for small children and their caretakers to participate in worship while remaining their authentic selves without the burden of feeling self-conscious. There are activity items in baskets under the table. Ask an usher for help with any of these options. You are welcome to be here, make noise, wiggle, and participate in the way that works best for you. *Ask an usher for help with any of these options. We want people of all ages to feel comfortable here!*

Offerings Your generous gifts sustain this faith community! --the outreach programs, music, choirs, utilities and facility upkeep plus our wonderful staff and more. FIRST READING: ACTS 2:1-21

When the day of Pentecost had come, [the apostles] were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each.

Amazed and astonished, they asked, “Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs – in our own languages we hear them speaking about God’s deeds of power.” All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, “What does this mean?” But others sneered and said, “They are filled with new wine.” But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, “Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o’clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: ‘In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord’s great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.’ ”




THE LORD'S PRAYER

Asbestos Abatement Project: The Boiler has been Decommissioned!

Thanks to everyone who has helped with moving the entire shop, the archives, and the food bank in preparation for the next four +/- weeks of asbestos abatement of the boiler piping and boiler! The old boiler has been decommissioned so we're now without it as a heat source. Since it's still spring, the main building may be a bit chilly. Be advised to bring sweaters and a coat if you're a chilly willy, and thanks for your understanding.

Please note that the following rooms are off limits during this process which we expect to run through the month of May: the old Youth/Game Room, Fireside Room, Fellowship Hall, Tree of Life Room, table and chair storage closet, the Custodian Shop, Shop Storage, and Boiler Rooms. The asbestos abatement for the food bank has been completed, and the food bank is back up and running. Currently the debris from work in this area is being stored in the fellowship hall. Note that the fellowship hall will remain off limits through the whole abatement process. Access to the food bank should be through the north main food bank door. Work is proceeding at the table and chair storage room and the space Anthony used as his office in the shop. Preliminary containment work is happening in the shop, shop storage and boiler room. Thanks for your patience as we move through this process.
